### **Osprey - Music - Motifs**

In Osprey class, we explored rhythm and repeated motifs in music. We had to work in teams to create our own motifs. It was a very noisy lesson, but we really enjoyed making our own music and sharing our ideas with the class.





### Owl - YoYo - Christianity Workshop

In Owl class, we took part in an RE workshop with YoYo. We discovered different ways Christians view God, with examples from the Bible, using different forms of



expression. We discovered that the Bible was written by over 40 different authors who are responsible for penning the words Christian's read and reflect upon today. We were also interested to discover that the Old Testament took around 1,000 years to write!

As part of our Christianity unit in RE, we visited St. James the Deacon church to experience a Christian ceremony. Fr.Luke and Mrs Wands helped to deliver a pretend wedding! ### Music: Ancient Egypt Composition

In Music, we have been learning how to compose our very own music. Using hieroglyphic notation to help us, we chunked a piece of music down into sections before using stave notation to create our own pieces. Finally, we composed our own Pharaoh funeral tunes and performed them to our classmates using glockenspiels.

As part of our DT topic, we learnt all about motors and different motorised products. We were then able to create our own simple circuit using: batteries, motors, wires and battery packs. After this, we designed our very own doodlers by using our moving circuit to create a little creature, who could draw his very own patterns.

In Year 5, we were kindly given the opportunity to attend a Yoyo reflective workshop. We discussed and took part in many activities that helped us to reflect on different aspects of our lives; considering things we are grateful for at home, at school, in our local community and across the world.

### Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. *Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.* 

**Breakfast Club:** (7.50-8.50am) **£4.20/session £3.15/siblings**. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) £8.20/session £7.18/sibling. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

If you are interested in our wrap-around care options, please pop into the office and ask for our wraparound care administrator, Caroline Young.

### **Childminders**

- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
