Sophie M – every day you come to school with an incredible attitude and try your absolute best. Thank you for being such a positive role model in Finch class.


Shout outs - Robin

Connor- For making me smile by reading with different voices for each character in guided reading. You really made the story come alive! Well done you!


Maths

Ben - Well done to Ben, who has been working extra hard on his handwriting! Ben has been taking his time and his hard work has been paying off!


Shout outs - Owl

Science - Properties of Materials:

This week, in Science, we have been looking at the different properties and changes of materials. We tested for hardness by scratching the materials with a nail and we tested their permeability by measuring how much water they could absorb. We have also discussed the solubility of different substances by combining them with solvents to see if they dissolve.



Fitness - Skipping Games:

We built our skipping skills in P.E Fitness this week in groups. Remembering to bend our knees, jump to miss the rope and jump in with our partners was step one. Next, we tried turning by 90 degrees on each jump - counting how many we could do. Finally, we lengthened the ropes to see how many children could jump in unison!





Forest Schools - Survival Skills:

Across this half term, in our Forest School sessions, Year 5 will be learning lots of different survival skills. We thoroughly enjoyed our first session, where we were constructing our very own shelters. We learnt how to tie a variety of different knots that would help make our structures strong and safe before considering how to make our shelters windproof and waterproof.

Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.

Breakfast Club: (7.50-8.50am) £4.20/session £3.15/siblings. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) **£8.20/session £7.18/sibling**. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

- Universal Credit, (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also <u>not entitled to Working Tax Credit</u> and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit

A run-on of Working Tax Credit – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
