96.60%


Well done and thank you to all those parents who managed to get their child to school on time every day!


Hummingbird

To kick off our first science unit: 'Living things and their habitats' we had the chance to explore our outdoor area and see if we could group different items. We were challenged to find something living, something non-living and something that has never lived. To help us, we used our knowledge of 'MRS GREN' (movement, respiration, sensitivity, growth, reproduction, excretion and nutrition). We had some great discussions along the way especially the debate of whether an apple is alive or not!

After securing our skills of passing a football accurately using the inside of our foot we then began to use other parts of our foot which for many of us was trickier. The children loved using these skills to take part in different activities which showcased their talents!

Finch class have made a wonderful start to the year and I have been really impressed with their enthusiasm and attitudes in all lessons.


Teddy H - your maths work has been incredible! I have been so impressed at how well you have been able to apply your knowledge to different challenges. Well done Teddy!

For our fitness lesson this week we did skipping activities.


We were so good at trying the different skipping techniques and it definitely got our heart racing! Well done Year 3 - keep up the hard work!

We started our unit, 'Power Prints' by focusing on the power of drawing, exploring the work of different artists such as; Henry Moore and Henri Matisse. We discovered how to use tone to add depth and detail to our work. We enjoyed using hatching to add a different style of tone. At the end of the Art unit, children worked collaboratively to apply learnt skills and techniques to produce a large scale piece using patterns and prints. The children had to decide if they wanted their piece to be 'abstract' or 'figurative'. The end products were absolutely fantastic and it was great to see the children showcase their brilliant teamwork skills.

In netball this week, we have learnt how to use a bounce pass in order to send the ball into the D. We saw incredible teamwork and children have started to build their attacking and defending skills. Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.

Breakfast Club: (7.50-8.50am) £4/session £3/siblings. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) **£8/session £7/sibling**. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

If you are interested in our wrap-around care options, please pop into the office and ask for our wraparound care administrator, Caroline Young.
