Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.

Breakfast Club: (7.50-8.50am) £4/session £3/siblings. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) **£8/session £7/sibling**. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

If you are interested in our wrap-around care options, please pop into the office and ask for our wraparound care administrator, Caroline Young.

What is being offered?

Foxwood Community Hub is delighted to be able to announce that we will have a range of free activities, craft items and children's "grab a bag" pack lunches throughout the summer holidays.

We can offer this provision through the securing of three sources of funding. The first of which is the Holiday Activities Fund. HAF is funded by the City of York Council.

The second piece of funding is a ward grant given by the Westfiled Ward.

The third source of funding is a JRHT grant.

Who can access what is on offer?

All local children whether they are eligible for free school meals or not. Ideally what we are offering is aimed at children 5 and above just in terms of the suitability of the activities and the craft kits, however, our "grab a bag" lunches are suitable for children under 5 and we will have some suitable activities such as colouring and simple craft activities available for younger children.

*Please note we may discreetly ask you if your children receive free school meals or not, this is just so we can have a rough idea of who accessed our provision, you will not be asked for any identifiable information about you or your children.

How do I book my place?

You can find the breakdown of what is being offered each Friday on our Summer holidays at Foxwood community Hub poster.

There is no need to pre-book for any of the tutor-led activities, as places on these activities will be offered on a first come first serve basis. If our tutor-led activities have allocated all their places when you arrive your child will still be offered a free "grab a bag" packed lunch and a free craft kit/ activity that they will be able to take away with them. We will also have some other activities such as colouring and simple craft activities for children who are not part of the tutor-led activities to take part in.
