
Gymnastics

and water back.

Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. *Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.*

Breakfast Club: (7.50-8.50am) **£4.20/session £3.15/siblings**. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) £8.20/session £7.18/sibling. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

If you are interested in our wrap-around care options, please pop into the office and ask for our wraparound care administrator, Caroline Young.

Childminders

Support Via the Pupil Premium

Given the difficult times and changes to people's circumstances. If you feel that you might be eligible to claim 'Pupil Premium' for your child, we will be able to support you with items such as school uniform, breakfast club and daily school meals etc... Please email our school office

- Universal Credit, (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also <u>not entitled to Working Tax Credit</u> and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit

A run-on of Working Tax Credit - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Tapestry is a fantastic online learning platform that nursery and reception use to document a child's learning journey in the EYFS. It is an amazing tool that is a direct link with school and home. It can be accessed via an internet browser or relatives can even download the app.

Whilst teachers work hard to capture 'wow' and 'significant' moments in a child's learning journey at school, we also highly encourage relatives to do the same at home. That way we can see and support a child's whole learning journey! If your child is in EYFS, we would love to see photos and even videos of what your child does outside of school. This could be learning achievements/skills such as writing their name, learning to ride their bike or making a wonderful piece of artwork. It could even be something linked to your child's interests or special events too!

In addition to this, keep an eye out for Tapestry memos. The EYFS team uses the memo function of Tapestry to share key messages about learning in school and may also set a challenge or two from time to time.

Year 5 Football at York High School


York High School are running after school recreational football sessions at Energise, for any children in Year 5 who may be considering attending York High School from September 2024.
