Monday 26th September marks the European Day of Languages which is an event which aims to celebrate and promote all world languages and has been celebrated in many European countries since 2001. To mark the day and to encourage the children to think about the benefits and opportunities which foreign language learning can bring, the children's Spanish lessons last week were a little different with each Year group taking part in different linguistic or cultural activities. Year 3 had to recognise the native languages in which various Disney Princesses sang their famous songs and then completed a competitive Kahoot quiz on their chromebooks to learn some language learning facts. Year 4 took part in a flag recognition competition as well as the Kahoot quiz; Year 5 and 6 watched some entertaining video clips to promote language learning and saw the pitfalls of relying on Google translate! Year 5 then completed a word origins task and Year 6 did a scavenger hunt around the top floor of school looking to identify world famous landmarks and find out where they are and when they were built. Hopefully, the children all gained a greater appreciation for other languages and cultures and will be inspired to continue learning foreign languages in the future.

#### Keeping Healthy!

For our new science topic 'Myself Growing Up', Reception have started to think about our bodies and how we can keep our bodies strong and healthy. We have enjoyed trying out new exercises, sorting different foods, printing with fruits and vegetables and even designing pictures of our own healthy, balanced meals.

In our current 'Body Management' PE topic we have been exploring a variety of rolling, slithering and turning. We have also looked at jumping using different take offs and landings using different equipment including mats, hoops, cones and balls. We have been very impressed how the children have settled into PE sessions with their enthusiasm and brilliant listening skills.



In science, we have been learning about electricity and we have found it very exciting. To finish our topic, we used circuits to make buzzer games. To do this, we had to work as a team to build working circuits. We then used pieces of wire to make our buzzer game. We had to have a steady hand so we didn't touch the wire together and make the buzzer sound! We have really enjoyed our science unit and we learnt a lot about electricity.

This week, we have thought about different ways to respect and care for our learning environment. #### The magical world of Owls

This week in English, we are writing a non-chronological report on our class bird, the Owl. We started our genre by discussing key features of a non-chronological report. We discussed using formal language, using subheadings to organise information and including subject specific vocabulary. We then carried out our own research, categorising our information into different groups. We put our computing skills to use as we completed a collaborative google document! We are looking forward to writing all about Owls and hope to share our findings with you all soon!

#### **Computing: Search Engines**

This half term, in Computing, we have been looking at different search engines and have discussed the reliability of online information and fake news. We compared three different search engines and evaluated the strengths and weaknesses of them. We found it incredibly interesting to discuss the level of privacy each search engine allows us to have.



#### Earth and Space: The Moon Cycle

Our science topic this half term was Earth and Space. We had a lot of fun replicating the movements of the Sun, Earth and Moon in small groups. We showed how the Earth rotates on its axis while orbiting the Sun and used a hoop for accuracy to show how the Moon orbits the Earth. Using torches, we observed the way that the Moon reflects the sun's light and creates the lunar cycle.



#### Science: Shadow Experiment

In order to be able to observe the Earth orbiting the sun, alongside how day and night occur, we conducted a science experiment with shadows. We observed how our shadows moved at different times of the day to reach our conclusions. We noticed that the sun appears to rise from east to west (which means the Earth rotates anticlockwise on its axis) and that our shadows were the shortest at lunchtime! This was because the sun was directly overhead and therefore the closest to our objects! We recorded and analysed our results using a line graph.

We were amazed that the first computer was able to crack the codes, consequently shortening the war by 2 years, saving 14 million people.



#### <u>Census</u>

We had a great time launching into our new History topic, finding out about census statistics! We used our inference skills to identify job roles, family relations and marital status from people living in 1881- we were fascinated to find out that Prince Albert was listed as Head of Household, even though Victoria was Queen!



#### Yoga

Namaste. Year 6 loved performing yoga alongside an audio of 'Harry Potter and the Philosopher Stone'. They exercised and stretched, showing great flexibility and enthusiasm. They had lots of fun practicing the different yoga positions: mountain pose, downward do, warrier and cat pose.

#### Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. *Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.* 

**Breakfast Club:** (7.50-8.50am) **£4.20/session £3.15/siblings**. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) £8.20/session £7.18/sibling. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

If you are interested in our wrap-around care options, please pop into the office and ask for our wraparound care administrator, Caroline Young.

### **Childminders**

- Universal Credit, (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also <u>not entitled to Working Tax Credit</u> and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- A run-on of Working Tax Credit paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
