The Reggio Emilia approach

We draw inspiration from the childhood centres of Reggio Emilia in Northern Italy. Reggio Emilia's philosophy is world famous for providing children with the very best in childcare and education.

The core values of Reggio Inspired classrooms are:

- Children are active participants in their learning.
- Teachers and children share the learning process, finding out things together.
- Relationships between school, parents and community are strong.
- The environment is stimulating, challenging, calm and thoughtful.
- Children's learning is celebrated.







Our environment is designed to encourage independence and freedom of choice, where children can take a lead in their own play, learning and development.

We provide opportunities to inspire and ignite children's interest and passions for life-lang learning.

With Reggio inspired classrooms we see the environment as the 'Third Teacher'. Our aims are also inspired by children's curiosity,

- To provide a setting which reflects **beauty**; from the delicate authentic resources to the wondrous natural objects—all declaring, all showing their beauty!
- To encourage curiosity and exploration. Curiosity is the desire to learn. It is an
 eagerness to explore, discover and figure things out. As educators, we aim to
 support and reinforce this innate curiosity to give children the confidence to develop
 their own theories about our incredible world.
- To provide lots of **natural light** and calm, cosy spaces.
- Hygge Hygge is a Danish word used when acknowledging a feeling or moment, ordinary or extraordinary as cosy, charming or special. Reggio inspired settings would seek to create an environment that captures that feeling of cosiness, warmth and togetherness for all who enter in to it.
- To offer plentiful **outdoar experiences** and cultivate a love of nature and all her gifts. "The best classroom and the richest cupboard are roofed only by the sky" - Margaret McMillan.

The Early Years Foundation Stage

Our nursery and reception classes are based upon the principles set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage.



The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) sets the standards that all early years providers must meet to ensure that children learn and develop well and are kept healthy and safe. It promotes teaching and learning to ensure children's 'school readiness' and gives children the broad range of knowledge and skills that provide the right foundation for good future progress through school and life.



The introduction to the framework states that:

"Every child deserves the best possible start in life and the support that enables them to fulfil their potential. Children develop quickly in the early years and a child's experiences between birth and age five have a major impact on their future life chances. A secure, safe and happy childhood is important in its own right. Good parenting and high quality early learning together provide the foundation children need to make the most of their abilities and talents as they grow up." Four guiding principles should shape practice in early years settings. These are:

- 1. Every child is a <u>unique child</u>, who is constantly learning and can be resilient, capable, confident and self-assured.
- 2. Children learn to be strong and independent through positive relationships.
- 3. Children learn and develop well in <u>enabling environments with teaching and</u> <u>support from adults</u>, who respond to their individual interests and needs and help them to build their learning over time. Children benefit from a strong partnership between practitioners and parents and/or carers.
- 4. Importance of *learning and development*. Children develop and learn at different rates. The framework covers the education and care of all children in early years provision, including children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).



Areas of learning and development

The Prime Areas

- Communication and Language
- Physical development
- Personal, social and emotional development

The Specific Areas

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive arts and design

We explore these areas through exciting and engaging learning activities.

Communication and Language

Communication and language is at the heart of early years.

Within EYFS we are very fortunate to run a communication and language curriculum based around the 'WellComm' speech and language programme and 'the statutory framework' for Communication and Language'. The WellComm programme supports children in their language and comprehension development through individually tailored activities. As part of this, children are assessed through a mixture of standard observations and fun activities which are part of our weekly planning.

The programme contains activities that will help to develop the following skills:

- Listening
- Comprehension
- Increasing understanding and use of concepts and vocabulary
- Conversational skills eye contact, turn taking, sharing, asking/answering questions etc.
- Grammatical skills







WellComm works alongside the child's actual ages and uses a traffic light system to highlight where support, if any, is needed.

If support is needed, the children will have a tailored programme for them where we will work alongside them in small groups, individually or as a whole class to support and develop their language skills.

There may also be activities that can be used at home to support your child. Staff will advise parents after the initial screening process if this is something that we can work together on. Activities, based on the WellComm, will be integrated into daily practise for all children throughout the year to ensure that language development is supported effectively.

As speech and language plays a vital part in children's development and early education we feel that this programme is particularly beneficial.

What to bring for nursery



We would encourage our nursery children to wear comfortable clothes and shoes. Old clothes are perfect for nursery as we do like getting rather messy! The children will need to move around freely and not be worried about getting their clothes and shoes dirty. We spend a lot of time exploring outside with activities such as digging, playing in the Mud Kitchen and going on regular forest walks in all weathers.

We also promote independence, so clothes that are easy enough for your child to have a go putting on themselves, such as jogging bottoms or leggings are a great choice.

School uniform

Although uniform is non-compulsory, if you would like, your child can wear a school sweatshirt and jogging bottoms/leggings as a uniform.

What to bring for reception

At Woodthorpe, reception children wear school uniform.

This includes:

- Black or grey trousers or shorts, grey skirt, pinafore dress or red gingham dress
- Plain or embroidered with logo white or red polo top or plain white button shirt
- Red jumper or cardigan with or without logo
- Dark coloured or white socks or plain grey black or red tights

Footwear:

- Low-heeled dark coloured shoes or boots suitable for active play or trainers
- Open-toed sandals should not be warn, even in the Summer Term for health and safety reasons.

Additianal:

- Water bottle
- Book Bag

We will ask you later in the year to please provide a PE Kit. This will not be required for the Autumn Term, therefore we will write to parents/carers when this is needed.

Tapestry ONLINE LEARNING JOURNAL

We share your child's learning journey with you online. We use a program called 'Tapestry' to document some of your child's achievements. We will contact parents/ carers in the Autumn Term with your log on details.

What is Tapestry?

Tapestry is an online learning platform that documents your child's learning journey in all areas of the Early Years Curriculum. It is a fantastic tool which provides communication between home and school. It can be used on an internet browser or via the Tapestry app (for mobiles and other devices). Tapestry allows written information, photographs and videos to be shared.

How we use Tapestry

At Woodthorpe, we use this observation tool to capture the 'wow' and 'significan' moments in a child's learning journey. We will not document every moment in the child's play/learning. This allows practitioners quality time to engage and interact with children. Observations will be used to monitor a child's learning journey and will be used to identify children's emerging needs, interests and next steps.

Parents/Carers

All parents/carers will be given the opportunity to sign up to Tapestry via their personal email address. Once an email address has been provided, we will activate your account and assign you to your child. You will receive an email to set up your account and password. When the account is activated, you will be able to view all content linked to your child and add your own observations. You will receive notifications when a new observation is added.

In EYFS, we aim to gain a wider understanding of a child's learning journey both at school and at home. We love to see observations; it is a great discussion point with the children and allows us to see what children do out of school. Parents/ carers can use Tapestry to capture their child's interests or any 'wow' and 'significant' moments in their child's learning journey. This may include learning at home, days out, holidays, special events, new skills, interests etc... Teachers will respond to parent/carers observations via the comment section and/or 'like' the observation.

Memos

The memo section is a communication tool to strength home-school relationships. It allows practitioners to include notes, clickable links to other webpages, media, and documents. Memos may be used for the purposes below:

- ¤ Send out a whole cohort/class/group message.
- ¤ Send out learning/homework/ additional supporting materials to parents/carers.

¤ To be used to inform parents/carers what the forthcoming learning will be. This is to engage families with learning in school, support children's interests and encourage communication.

Nursery Lunches



If your child is going to be staying for any lunchtime sessions at nursery there are a couple of options:

- You can choose a school dinner or

- Your child can bring a healthy nut-free pack-up with an icepack.

Our school meal provider is Dolce School Catering.

To view menus and pre-order meals please login to your School Grid account. Please note that meals can be ordered up to a term in advance but must be ordered via the School Grid no later than 8:55am on the day that the meal is required.

If your child is arriving at lunchtime for the afternoon, they can be dropped off at around 11:40am. If your child is going home after lunch, the children are normally ready for collection between 12:30pm and 12:35pm.



Snack time

All children receive a free piece of fruit at snack time. Water is always available too. Your child can also receive a carton of milk if you apply for it. This can be done via: www.coolmilk.com. Milk is free for 3 and 4 year olds and then paid for when your child turns 5. Please ask the school office for more information.



We would also encourage your child to bring a refillable water bottle each day to nursery with their name on.

Reception lunches

Children eat their lunch in the dining hall with their friends. Our mid-day supervisors help the children to cut their food but it's really helpful if your child has learnt to use a knife and fork. After our lunch the children go and play with their friends on the KSI playground.

Our school meal provider is Dolce School Catering.

Nursery:

- Engage in play activities and have some favourite things.
- Enjoy being with other children.
- Understand the word 'no' and the boundaries it sets for behaviour.
- Understand the word 'stop' and that it might be used to keep them safe.
- Use the toilet by themselves.
- Be able to take off their coat and put on their shoes.
- Recognise their own name (spoken and written).
- Talk in sentences.

Reception:

- Sit and listen for a short amount of time.
- Enjoy being with other children and share toys with their friends.
- Understand the word 'no' and the boundaries it sets for behaviour.
- Understand the word 'stop' and that it might be used to keep them safe.
- Use the toilet by themselves.
- Be able to take off their coat. Be able to put their coat on and zip it up.
- Be able to their take shoes off and put their shoes on.
- If they wear tights, pull them up by themselves.
- Eat their lunch with a knife and fork.
- Talk in sentences.
- Recognise their own name (spoken and written).
- Speak to an adult to ask for help.

Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as due to the childcare funding they receive, the charges are different.

Breakfast Club: Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.
