Celebrating Difference : Key Vocabulary	
Stereotype	A widely held but fixed and oversimplified image or idea of a particular type of person or thing.
Assumptions	Something that is supposed or believed without questioning.
Differences	A point or way in which people or things are dissimilar.
Bullying	Key features of bullying:
	 It doesn't just happen once: it goes on over time and happens again and again
	 It is deliberate: hurting someone on purpose, not accidentally
	 It is unfair: the person doing the bullying is stronger and more powerful (or there are more of them)
Right	Morally good, justified, or acceptable.
Wrong	Unjust, dishonest, or immoral.
Diverse	Of different kinds or sorts. Including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds, of different genders etc.
Value	The worth, importance, or usefulness of something.
