A huge thank you for your continued support in the school community with sharing random acts of kindness. This week, we have another two amazing children in our school to share with you!




that army veterans have a fair opportunity to gain employment, regardless of health conditions and disability. Harley, we are very proud of your achievements and money raised for this charity!

Forest school has begun!



Woodpecker - 'Solve it together' in PSHE!

In PSHE this half term, we are looking at Relationships. In this week's lessons, we focused on Friendships, and what we might do if conflicts arise. We used the Jigsaw 'Solve it together' technique to work through different scenarios that might cause conflict in our friendships. This involved hearing each side of the story, listening to each other's feelings, and coming together to find a win-win solution! Before writing this out in our books, a few members of Woodpecker class acted out working through a conflict and it really helped us to relate our learning to our real life experiences.

Ask us about...

In science, we have started our new topic called 'Plant Reproduction'. We are learning to identify what plants need to grow healthily, describe the structure and function of the parts of flowering plants, and investigate how plants transport water. Ask us how plants make their own food...

Osprey - Computing

In computing, we have been learning about computational thinking. In this lesson, we used this skill to tackle complex problems. We discovered that by breaking down the task into manageable chunks, we could solve the puzzle!





Owl - History

For our History lessons this week, we have been exploring how the Vikings travelled by investigating their longboats. We discovered the different features of the boats and debated a rationale for which is the most important feature.



Osprey - Science

In science, we have been learning about classification and changing habitats. In this topic, we have been making our own classification keys to classify living things. In this lesson, we created a classification key to identify invertebrates!





Owl - PE

This term we are exploring Cricket for our PE sessions. We have been learning how to throw, catch and hit the ball with accuracy and direction.

Ask us about...

In science, we have been learning about classification and changing habitats. We have been grouping vertebrates, invertebrates and plants using different data collection and classification methods. Ask us about it!


In History, we have been learning about the Vikings and if they were raiders, traders or settlers. We have been investigating who the Vikings were, why they came to Britain and how they travelled. Ask us about it!

Science

In Science this week, we have been learning about forces. We have learnt about gravity, air resistance and water resistance. We are learning about what happens when forces are balanced and unbalanced. We are developing our skills in working scientifically and we planned and conducted an experiment with three different sized balloons. In the experiment, the balloon size was a variable which changed as we had three different sizes of balloon (small, medium and large). We made sure to keep some variables the same, for example the height and location that we dropped them from. Our results showed that the larger the surface area, the slower the parachute dropped as there was more air resistance. We read an interesting non-fiction Guided Reading text this week which really helped to strengthen our knowledge about forces!

PSHE and RE

In PSHE this week, we have been learning about our personal qualities and characteristics. We are learning to identify the wonderful skills, qualities and virtues we have. This is all contributing toward building our selfesteem and celebrating ourselves as individuals! It tied in well with last week's unit in RE, in which we discussed the qualities that make a good leader and the different ways in which leaders might be chosen - either for their virtues or due to their lineage.





History

In History, we have been learning stories of historically significant people who have been featured on banknotes, including Winston Churchill, Jane Austen, J. M. W. Turner and Alan Turing. We are learning about the criteria for someone to be featured on a banknote and when we have completed our learning cycle we will be deciding who we think should be featured on the next banknote. We were so grateful to Karla and Marius for sharing the Danish Krone with us so we can compare this with our own currency.

Ask us about...

Air resistance - Why did the feather and the hammer fall at the same rate on the moon?

History- Mayan Timelines

This week, in History, Year 6 have been learning about where and when the ancient Maya lived. We started by thinking about the four periods that made up the Mayan civilisation: the Preclassic period, the Classic period, the Postclassic period and the Contact and Spanish Conquest Period. Following this, we plotted them accurately on a timeline, while considering historical periods that happened in Britain at the same time (the Bronze Age, the Iron Age, the Romans etc). This has strengthened both our understanding of our prior knowledge and chronology.



PE: Athletics (Long Jump)

Year 6 have been practising their long jumping skills in PE this week! By varying our run up lengths (between a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 11 strides), we have been able to explore how running up for a long jump can help improve our jump and distance. We had to be incredibly careful to make sure that we did not jump over the marker though because this would have been a foul!



Computing: Data Transmission

In our Computing lessons this week, we have started our second Big Data topic. By taking part in an unplugged activity, we have explored how data can be safely transferred: messages are now broken up into 'packets' and sent to recipients in a specific order to prevent corrupters from receiving the information.

This week, we have been learning about our circulation and health in science. Did you know that the circulatory system is actually called a double circulatory system? This is because two loops deliver blood from the heart; one loop pushes blood from the heart to the lungs and one pushes blood from the heart to the body. Ask us about it!

Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.

Breakfast Club: (7.50-8.50am) £4.20/session £3.15/siblings. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) £8.20/session £7.18/sibling. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

We are delighted to announce the launch of two new websites www.raiseyork.co.uk and www.yorksend.org. They have been created with children and young people, parents, carers and professionals to make it quicker and easier for local families to get the information they need about local services and community support.

The **Raise York** site is part of the city's new network of Family Hubs; a project funded by the Department for Education to bring together organisations supporting children and families in a 'one stop shop'. A network of people, places and online support from pregnancy through to adulthood (age 19 years, or 25 years for people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities), the aim is to make it easier to get advice, help and support on a wide range of topics including infant feeding, mental health support, health visits and parenting classes.

In partnership with Raise, York SEND Local Offer (yorksend.org) is also being relaunched onto it's own site. The new website site provides a dedicated resource for young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, their families and the professionals working with them.

The York SEND Local Offer sets out services and activities available to children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities; support is available from birth to 25 years old. Our website provides helpful information for families at every stage of their journey, whether this is to learn about what Special Educational Needs are, to find out about the support available with or without a diagnosis, or to understand what preparation for adulthood looks like for young people with disabilities, the website covers all.
