Within our computing lessons, we have discovered the importance of camera angles when taking photos or videos, learned how to import videos and photos into film editing software and incorporated transitions between images. We particularly enjoyed recording our own voice-over for the trailers! We even experimented with adding different sound effects! We cannot wait to preview our final trailers!





Magpie - Pyramid Planners!

As part of our exciting Egyptian topic, we delved into the world of pyramids! We discovered that the pyramids were built for the pharaoh's final resting place before they moved to the afterlife. We were interested to learn that the Egyptians believed that the stars were the entrance to the afterlife. We had to work in teams to solve a challenging pyramid problem in which we had to think carefully of different solutions to some difficult challenges! How did the Egyptians lift all that heavy limestone...

Woodpecker - Celery experiment!



In science, we have been exploring the parts of a plant and how these parts are used to make sure the plant stays healthy. As water is vital for a plant's growth, we learnt about how water is transported from the soil, through the stem through tiny holes, then reaching the leaves and flowers. To build our understanding further, we completed an experiment using a celery stick as the stem! With our coloured water, we saw that over a few days, the water had transported up the stem, just like in plants! We have loved bringing our learning into real life with lots of different experiments.

We then learnt more about the Vikings and their bloodthirsty battle tactics in a workshop - we also got to explore their armour and weaponry. At Jorvik Viking Centre, we went on an unforgettable ride, which took us back in time to experience how the Vikings lived.

Osprey - Fitness - Yoga

In Osprey class, we have been really enjoying our fitness sessions. In this lesson, our focus was yoga. To start, we discussed the benefits of yoga and how it can help our bodies. We then calmly and quietly practised some yoga poses to help stretch our muscles and improve our

In History, we have loved learning about the Vikings, we have been exploring the question "Were the Vikings traders, raiders or settlers?" To explore the idea of Vikings being traders, we played a trading game in which groups were different trading posts, bargaining their wares.

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Science- Unbalanced Forces

In Science this week, we are learning about unbalanced forces, in particular air resistance and gravity. We worked in teams to create wind powered pulley systems and tested different weights to see how the weight of the object impacted the force of gravity and the amount of wind required for the pulley system to be effective.







PE - Rounders

In PE this week, Kites and Falcons got out in the sunshine to play rounders on the field! We are learning about different positions and how to work together in teams to support and encourage each other. We have been so proud to see our bowlers developing their accuracy and aim when underarm throwing. We are learning about communicating to teammates about whether it is a good opportunity to run to the next base or not, as it can be tricky to run while tracking the ball.

Science: Blood and the Circulatory System

This week, we have been learning about the human circulatory system and blood. By going on the journey of a blood cell around the body, we have been able to explain why the blood goes through the heart twice, understand that veins take blood into the heart while arteries take the blood out and identify where oxygenated and deoxygenated blood can be located. After this, we have been able to create our very own blood model: mixing together oil to represent plasma, red food colouring to demonstrate red blood cells and marshmallows to hold the place of white blood cells!







Polling Day PE: Cricket and Rounders

What a treat for Year 6! After all of their hard work over the last few weeks, they thoroughly enjoyed their sports afternoon involving both cricket and rounders. Children were able to showcase their cricketing skills: discussing bowling and fielding techniques whilst working collaboratively as a team. The cricket coach was incredibly proud of their determination and their sportsmanship.

Woodthorpe wrap-around care

We are delighted to be able to offer full wraparound support for our families. This starts from 7.50am and continues until 5:45pm daily. Our offer includes care for all of our children, from nursery to year 6. Nursery pupils must book wraparound care sessions through the nursery as, due to the childcare funding, they receive, the charges are different.

Breakfast Club: (7.50-8.50am) £4.20/session £3.15/siblings. Children have a wide range of breakfasts and also have the chance to play games with their friends or take part in a morning physical activity to really help wake them up.

After School Club (3.15-5.45pm) **£8.20/session £7.18/sibling**. At after school club, children start the session by having a snack and completing a 'circle' activity. From this, pupils then have the option to complete activities with their friends, take part in physical activities or relax with a book or film.

If you are interested in our wrap-around care options, please pop into the office and ask for our wraparound care administrator, Caroline Young.

Dear Parent/Carers,

We are delighted to announce the launch of two new websites www.raiseyork.co.uk and www.yorksend.org. They have been created with children and young people, parents, carers and professionals to make it quicker and easier for local families to get the information they need about local services and community support.

The **Raise York** site is part of the city's new network of Family Hubs; a project funded by the Department for Education to bring together organisations supporting children and families in a 'one stop shop'. A network of people, places and online support from pregnancy through to adulthood (age 19 years, or 25 years for people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities), the aim is to make it easier to get advice, help and support on a wide range of topics including infant feeding, mental health support, health visits and parenting classes.

In partnership with Raise, York SEND Local Offer (yorksend.org) is also being relaunched onto it's own site. The new website site provides a dedicated resource for young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, their families and the professionals working with them.
